

Requirements for Recertification in Neuromusculoskeletal Medicine and Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine

Effective by action of the AOA Board of Trustees in 1995, all NMM/OMM certificates carry a ten-year period of expiration.

To be eligible for re-certification as a diplomate, a candidate must meet the following requirements:

- I. Maintain 150 hours in AOA approved CME in a 36-month period with 50 of those hours being category 1A and specifically in OMM as documented on the AOA CME printout;
- II. Hold a current license to practice in the United States;
- III. Must be a member in good standing of the American Osteopathic Association for a continuous period;
- IV. Must be able to show evidence of conformity to the standards set in the Code of Ethics of the American Osteopathic Association;
- V. Must apply to the AOBNMM for re-certification prior to the expiration date of his/her original or current certificate (can apply two years before the actual expiration);
- VI. Remit the examination fee of \$500.00 at the time of application;
- VII. Sit for a written examination (at a pre-determined site and date) before the expiration date of his/her original or current certificate;
- VIII. Confirm intent to sit for examination at the scheduled date (All candidates will be expected to sit at a time and place as per the Board's published examination schedule).
